

## **Program Standards**

The following standards pertain to particular cognitive, motor, behavioral and social skills that are associated with the educational process of the allied health program that you plan to pursue:

### **Diagnostic Imaging Technologies Program**

- A. Ability to walk, bend, squat, and stand; lift, push and pull heavy patients or objects
- B. Ability to move about and function effectively in confined spaces
- C. Eye/hand coordination ability sufficient to perform multiple diagnostic tasks simultaneously
- D. Ability to distinguish fine detail on a visual image and ability to distinguish among the gray scale variations. Sufficient visual acuity such as is needed in the accurate preparation and administration of contrast media and for the observation necessary for patient assessment and nursing care.
- E. Ability to distinguish auditory pitch while using equipment and to hear patient oral communications while in or out of view
- F. Ability to move an average adult patient, work several hours without a break and stand for long periods of time
- G. Communicate effectively with patients and other health care professionals
- H. Obtain, review and integrate pertinent patient history and supporting clinical data to facilitate optimum diagnostic results
- I. Understand and interpret oral and written instructions and perform appropriate procedures and record anatomical, pathological and/or physiological data for interpretation by a physician or health professional

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- J. Record and process test data and other pertinent observations made during the procedure for presentation to the interpreting physician or health professional
- K. Spacial aptitude sufficient to operate diagnostic equipment
- L. Participate in peer physical examination practicum
- M. Participate in invasive and non-invasive procedures
- N. Participate in emergency care
